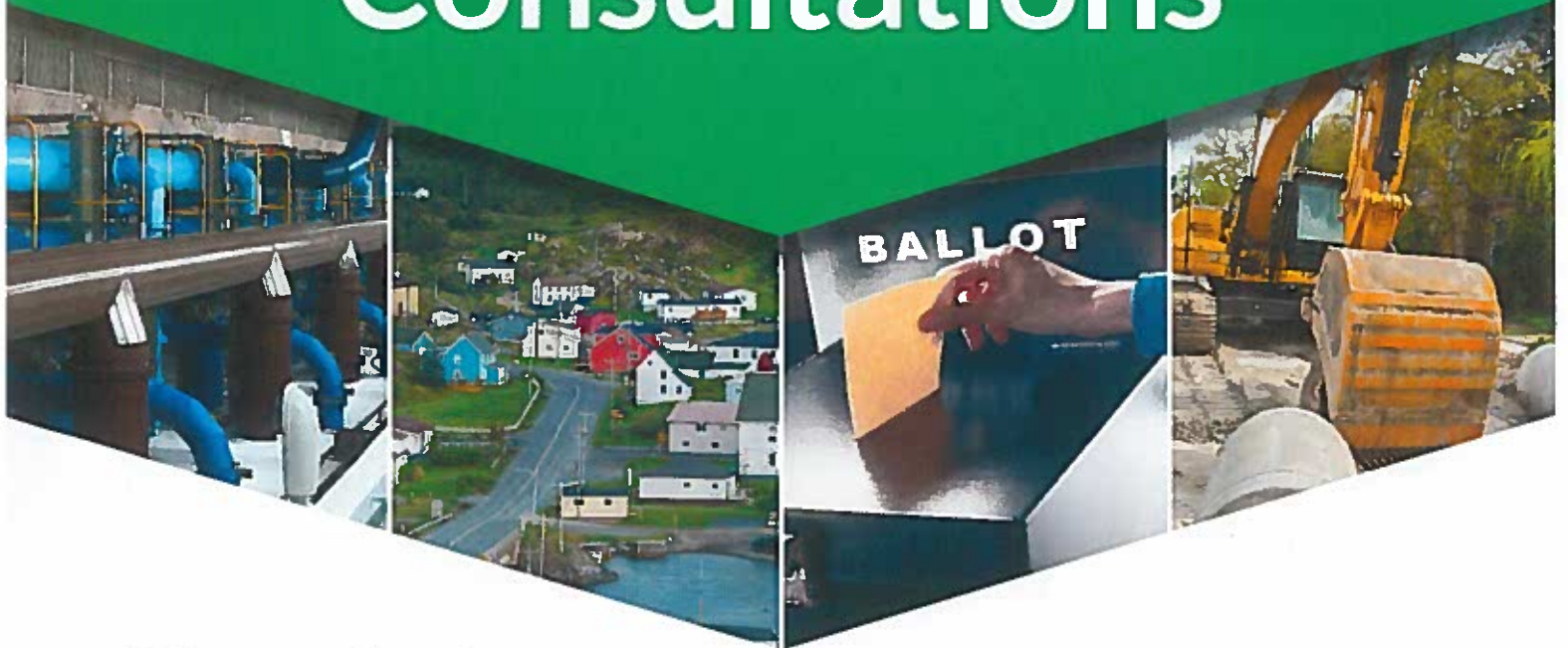


Regional Government Consultations

The Provincial Government is exploring a potential model for a new regional governance structure. A new structure will enhance and support local governments, facilitate regional services, build capacity, and assist existing local governments to be stronger and more sustainable.

Residents and stakeholders have continued to ask for a move to a regional government structure, and regionalization was identified as an emerging theme in the 2016 Government Renewal Initiative and the 2016 Premier's Forum. As outlined in *The Way Forward: Realizing Our Potential*, the Provincial Government has committed to exploring ways to implement regional governance and/or sharing of services pilot(s).

Re: Launch of Public Consultations on Regional Government

Date: August 22, 2017

The Provincial Government has committed to exploring a potential model for a new regional government structure and stated its intention in *The Way Forward: Realizing Our Potential*, to implement regional government and/or sharing of service pilot(s), as appropriate, by 2019. To support this commitment, the Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment is conducting public consultations on regional government.

Public consultations have been planned in response to concerns from residents and municipal leaders about the long term viability of the current local government system. The province's aging population has put a strain on communities, affecting their ability to attract candidates to local government office and to deliver efficient local services. Government has heard clearly that it is time to seriously explore regional government and greater regionalization as a possible solution.

Many municipal councillors and administrators took part in early consultations on regional government at the 2017 Municipalities Newfoundland and Labrador Symposium and the 2017 Professional Municipal Administrators Annual General Meeting. We thank you for your feedback. It has been incorporated into public consultations materials and will be part of future government-decision-making.

The public consultations will include 22 in-person consultation sessions across the province beginning September 6, 2017. You may also provide feedback online, by mail, or host your own session in your municipality. Any decision-making on regional government could impact municipalities and residents. We invite you to attend these sessions and encourage residents of your municipality to take part.
