NEW COMMUNITY WALKING TRAIL

The Town has constructed a beautiful new walking trail in the area of the Wexford Estates subdivision. With the residents in mind, the Town has created a safe, beautiful space for everyone to enjoy. FUNDING APPROVALS

Justina Centre Renovations *Total Project Cost \$548,384*

The Town received approval to do some upgrades to the Justina Centre, along with some general upgrades to Kelly Park. The total of this project is cost shared between the Town and both the Federal and Provincial governments. The Town's share of this project is \$165,748.

Power's Lane Stream Crossing *Total Project Cost \$514,554*

The approval for Power's Lane Stream Crossing will include upgrades to the existing. The total of this project is cost shared between the Town and both the Federal and Provincial governments. The Town's share of this project is \$46,662.

ATV SAFETY

A reminder that ATVs (quads, dirt bikes, and side-by-sides) are not permitted to be operated on public roadways under the Off-Road Vehicles Act. Operators found in violation under the regulations and the Act may be subject to fines and vehicle impoundment. Fines can range from \$100-\$2,500. For more information on ATV Fines, visit the Newfoundland & Labrador Regulation 30/22.

FOOD & BOOK PANTRIES

Did you know our Town has a Food Pantry located behind the Town Hall, and a Book Pantry located in Kelly Park? We encourage everyone to give to, and take, from these pantries!

RADON TEST KIT CHALLENGE

The goal of the 100 Radon Test Kit Challenge is to distribute Radon test kits to communities where there is a risk of elevated Radon levels, and where testing has thus far been limited. The Town has received a limited number of Radon Test kits to distribute throughout the community. SAFE DRINKING WATER

Water for drinking, cooking, brushing teeth, washing dishes and other domestic uses should be from a safe water supply. Water should be free from microorganisms such as bacteria that may cause disease. Testing your well water gives you a better picture of your well water quality and tells you whether or not it is safe to drink. It is recommended to have your water tested regularly for such contamination (once per year) or as required should you notice any change in colour or odour.

Water sample collection kits can be obtained at the Town Hall, located at 744 Logy Bay Road, or from the Public Health Laboratory at the Miller Centre on Forest Road. These kits are free of charge. For additional information please contact an Environmental Health Officer at a Service NL Government Service Centre location.

DOG PARK & PET TAGS

Our Dog Park has been a significant addition to our community! Many residents enjoy the space with their pets. The Dog Park is a great area for all of our residents to use and is open at all times for dogs of all sizes. As always, remember to pick up after your pet and treat the park with respect.

A reminder to get your pet a pet tag, to ensure their safety if found. Pet tags can be obtained at the Town Hall during regular business hours, free of charge.

JUSTINA CENTRE RENTALS

The Justina Centre is the hub of our Town. It houses many community groups such as our 50+ group, Bridge Club, Sparks, Embers, Girl Guides, Concert Crowd, Dart League and our summer programs. The building is used for meeting space, special events, private rentals, and much more.
