NEW COMMUNITY TRAIL NETWORK VISION REPORT

The Town of Logy Bay-Middle Cove-Outer Cove is home to many beautiful trail systems. This includes local trails, as well as part of the East Coast Trail network. In 2023, the Town engaged a consultant to provide a detailed trail plan for the community, and to provide some suggestions and proposals for current and future trail development.

A special thank you to Mills & Wright Landscape Architecture, as well as all of the residents and community groups who worked together, and attended public engagement sessions, all which have helped shaped this report. A copy of the report can be found on our website!

SPECIAL PROJECTS

Stick Pond Brook Retaining Wall & Stream Crossing

This project is well underway and on track to be completed in October 2024. The Town would like to thank all resident for their patience and respect of the project site throughout the summer months. This project has included replacing the retaining wall and cross culverts to eliminate the risk of road washouts and damage.

Justina Centre Renovations

The Town received approval to do some upgrades to the Justina Centre, along with some general upgrades to Kelly Park. The total of this project is cost shared between the Town and both the Federal and Provincial governments. This project is expected to start over the winter months.

Power's Farm Road - Rehabilitation

This project will rehabilitate the roadway in its entirety by replacing culverts, asphalt, shouldering, and landscaping to ensure the road's stability and access for many years to come. This project is set to begin in the Spring of 2025.

A reminder that ATVs (quads, dirt bikes, side-by-sides, etc.) are not permitted to be operated on public roadways under the Off-Road Vehicles Act. Operators found in violation under the Regulations and the Act may be subject to fines and vehicle impoundment. Fines can range from \$100-\$2,500.
